FOUNDATION ACTIVITIES

WHAT WE DO

Our services or work scope include organizing community health intervention projects within and outside the Federal Capital Territory. We create access to Basic Education by giving provisional education scholarships, and building/renovating schools. We carry out skill acquisition empowerment programs for persons leaving with disabilities and internally displaced persons in the IDPs Camps across Nigeria which will benefit them as well as make them discover and exhibit their talents thereby attaining a better life

PROVISION OF PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

Leaderjoe1808foundation carries out medical outreach by giving free Eye-screening programs for secondary school children. Distribution of anti-malaria drugs, de-worming drugs, typhoid medications, vitamins & multi-vitamins capsules for adults and children in virtually all the IDP camps in Abuja-Nigeria as well as the provision and distribution of treated mosquitos' nets to every household in the camps. The provision and accessibility of the aneroid sphygmomanometer which is mainly used to check Blood Pressure manually as well as the provision and accessibility of a glucose monitoring device also known as a glucometer to combat the high rise of diabetes among the Internally Displaced Persons.



The free medical outreach usually comes up on the last Saturday of every month. Here, we engage our partners, sponsors, and volunteers to come out in large numbers to participate. Participation is graded in one's area of speciality. Doctors and nurses effectively engage in their activities based on the outlined project. Each medical project is selected based on the occurring and re-occurring medical issues at the Internally Displaced Persons Camps (IDP) and people with disabilities.

FOUNDATION ACTIVITIES

FOOD DISTRIBUTION PROGRAMME

Leaderjoe1808foundation carries out annual feed One Thousand programs, a food distribution programme for Internally Displaced Persons and people with disabilities. Clothing and clean water are also distributed on a regular basis through a network of volunteers. We collaborate with other Charities organisation to engage the government in a dialogue to improve welfare and expand fundraising events. We engage our partners, sponsors, and volunteers to come out in large numbers to participate. Participation is graded in one's area of speciality.

Giving scholarships to over 2000 orphans and vulnerable in Kaduna, Sokoto, Edo states, and in the Federal Capital Territory of Nigeria. Distribution of over One Hundred Thousand (100,000) motivational books to secondary school students to curb the incessant moral decadence on the rise.

SCHOLARSHIP AND EDUCATIVE PROGRAMMES



FOUNDATION ACTIVITY

EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM

We carry out skills acquisition projects aimed at empowering underserved communities. Collaborated with other Charities in setting up a need library for Internally Displaced Children and carrying out fundraising.

As an ongoing project, we have the following; Training One Hundred (100) women from the IDP camps in fashion design and sewing. This project started on the 1st of May 2022. Training Fifty (50) orphans in Agro-processing, powdering of some food products, and how to naturally preserve.



WATER PROJECT

At the tail-end of the year 2021, we rehabilitate pipe-borne water in one of the under-served communities in the FCT, which is in commemoration of our annual feed One Thousand program. our water project has the mandate to build pipe-borne water for as many communities having challenges accessing clean and healthy water.

PROVIDING BENEFIT TO THE PUBLIC

Leaderjoe1808foundation promotes good health care and well-being, promoting Quality Education and skills acquisition, especially for the youth and widows, people with disabilities and internally displaced persons, thereby reducing the high unemployment rate.

Leaderjoe1808foundation promotes sustainable consumption and production through agro-allied farming. This reduces the rise of insecurity and high-level of poverty within these communities and greater impact on society. Engage constructively and strategically in ventures that will benefit humanity. We assiduously and tenaciously pinpoint and work towards avenues that will improve people's lives. We seek better collaborations that will enable us to give back to society. One of our sustainable projects is to collaborate with the Agriculture Industry in Scotland to promote Agro exchange programs. We feel a strong connection to Scotland and its humanitarian history, which goes as far back as the early Scottish Missionaries to Nigeria, the earliest and most famous Scottish missionaries still mentioned in Nigeria are David Livingstone, Mary Slessor, Hope Masterton Waddell, William Anderson and Hugh Goldie.

Leaderjoe1808foundation is committed to ensuring provision for the most disadvantaged and communities that include internally displaced persons, who are affected by disasters, extreme poverty and those with disabilities. 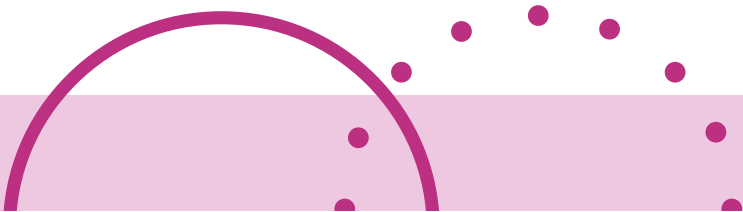

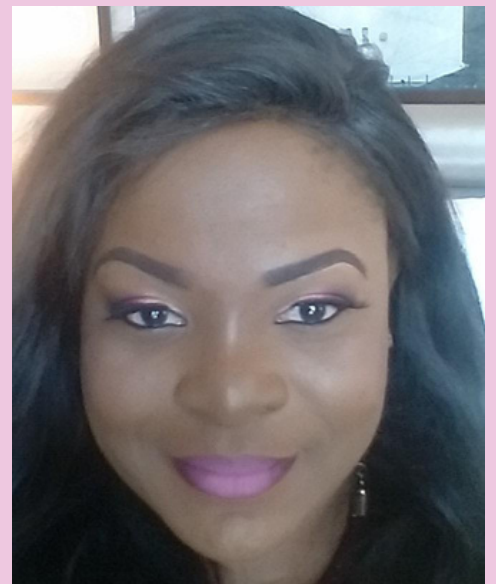

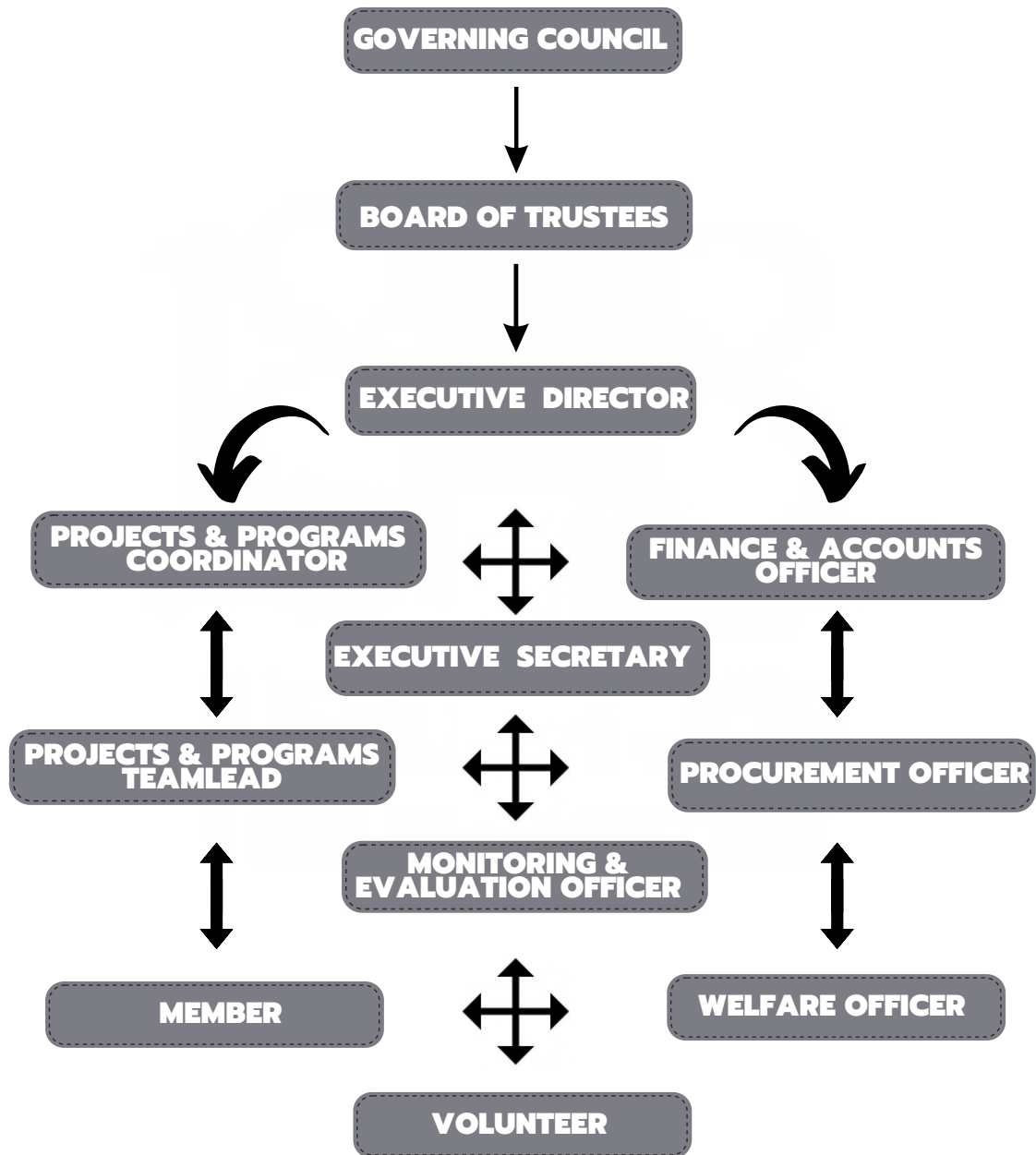
EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

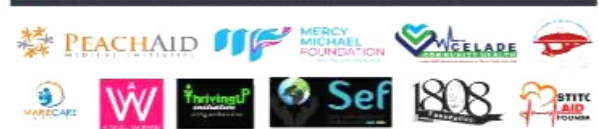

OVERVIEW

our project overview includes organizing community health interventions, provision of quality basic education (Back2School) projects and using sports to promote peace among teenagers within and outside the Federal Capital Territory.

Our quality Basic Education programs involved giving provisional education scholarships and building/ renovating schools. 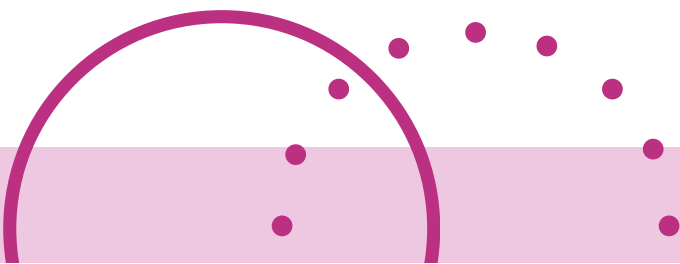

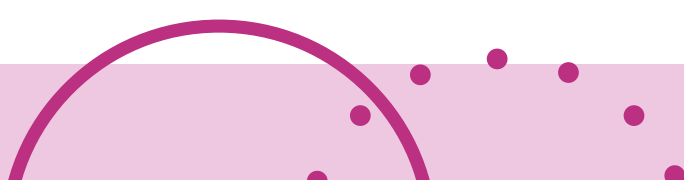
15 of them to resume the session with Gwiwa Model Primary School and Kalambiana Primary School will as well be admitting 15 students to the ongoing school session.

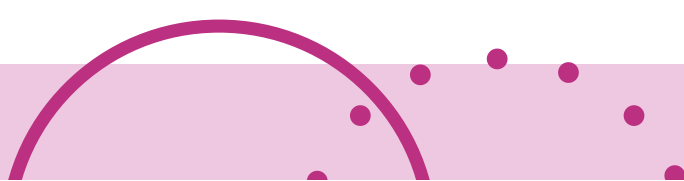

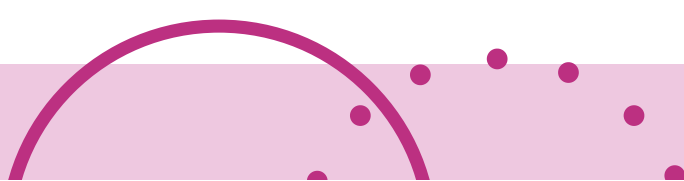

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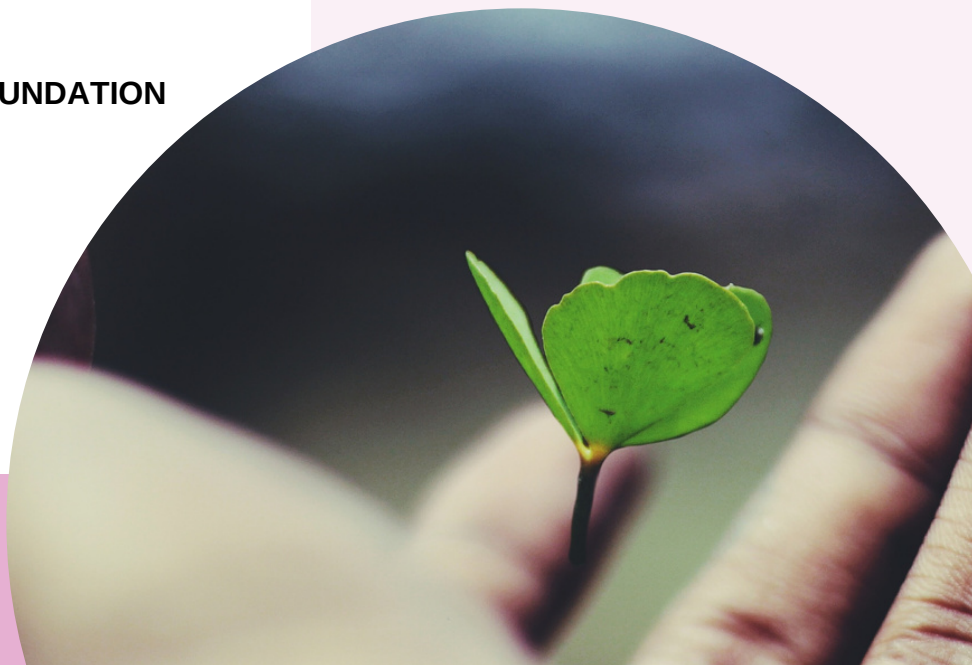
